

CEOF Executive Director's Report Virtual Meeting September 18, 2024

Updates & Discussion

<u>Stallions, Sips & Savories</u> Saturday, October 19th; Coolmore America's Ashford Stud

As you know the ticket link is live. We have sold approximately 30 tickets thus far. The invitations were mailed last Friday so I expect the ticket sales to pick up midweek as people receive their invites. Just a reminder we only have 125 tickets we are able to sell. The waiver is online and AS is fine with the ticket purchaser adding their guest names and clicking the box that the waiver has been read.

We currently have \$20,000 in sponsorships. I have reached out to others who I am waiting to hear back from as well as seeking additional sponsors. Your help and/or connections, would be greatly appreciated.

We have applied to the ABC for the license to auction alcohol and expect approval this week. The online auction should go live the first week of October ending at the event October 19th.

Mary Sparks and I had an online demo with **QGive**, the auction technology arm of Bloomerang. The good news is we do not have to be fully onboarded with Bloomerang in order to set up and go live with the auction. We will be able to promote the silent auction on our social media pages, but not the event. I will ask TDN to promote the auction and to do a follow up article after the event with AS approval before it goes to print.

The silent auction continues to develop (between Saratoga and the September Sales it's been yet another tricky time to connect with those in the equine world). I have a few meetings during the sales so I'll update you at our meeting. I would like to present 20-25 packages for auction.

I am in the process of creating a draft of the budget for this event. The expenses will be relatively low. I will share with the CEOF Finance committee at our next meeting.

Professional Development Ongoing

Lisa Deaton Mahan and I have had two meetings. The first session was spent getting to know one another and sharing the journey of CEOF from 2015 to present. The second session included the topics of milestone goals (we discussed setting 1,2, 3, 5 and 10 year goals), mission partners (I had just discussed this with St. Joe's Foundation Director the week prior) where you approach a sponsor one time for multiple events and they build it in their annual

budgets, planned giving, wealth screening (she thinks we need to add on what Bloomerang has to offer at \$225 per year (more for connections than wealth), and several community organizations we might want to connect with in the future. We are looking forward to our presentation at the retreat in November.
